

Health Check Reminders

Some members have not been returning the yearly health check form fully completed by their veterinarian. As a reminder, the handbook states the following: "An original health check form must be completed (all sections) with the veterinarian's signature."

Many times, the exam and/or stool check sections are not getting filled out or being completed. These, along with <u>all</u> vaccinations listed, are required. An original P.E.T. P.A.L.S. health check form, with the original signature, must be filed annually regardless of veterinarian or veterinary clinic. These forms are available on our new website. Please note that we are no longer accepting copies of the pet's records from the vet's office.

We know that our members understand the need for consistency and thoroughness so we can continue to be the well-respected organization we have been for 34 years. If you have not returned a completed form, please do so as soon as possible. Thank you for your assistance and continued support.


