

P.E.T. P.A.L.S. Helps Save Pets with Oxygen Masks

Lately there have been stories on television about various fire departments using pet oxygen masks to save animals. In 2008, P.E.T. P.A.L.S. joined with area veterinarians to donate fourteen sets of masks to every fire station in Waterloo, Cedar Falls, and Evansdale.



Since then, representatives from P.E.T. P.A.L.S.

periodically visit each station to see if any replacements are needed. Recently, one additional set was donated to Cedar Falls and two sets to Waterloo along with one replacement mask. Area firefighters have expressed their gratitude for these and talk about how often they are used to help save an animal's life. P.E.T. P.A.L.S. is proud to be able to continue to support their efforts.

We purchase the oxygen masks from Wag+N O2 Fur Life. They are "an educational and public safety company dedicated to providing pet oxygen masks to first responders across North American to help them save animal lives following structural fires."
