

Remembering Fletch by Rita Lynn



When I saw his picture posted at Petco, I knew he was the kind of dog I was looking for. I soon found out, however, that as a ten-month-old puppy, Fletch was more than a handful. I had to learn that if I didn't keep him busy he would find something to do by himself, and his choices were almost always destructive.

Fortunately, as he matured, I learned how to teach him and keep him busy, and he became a trusted pet partner. His remarkable intelligence allowed him to master a long list of tricks as well as to learn things on his own.

For example, I never taught him to get his leash for walks or visits, but one day, after a visit with Otis, I inadvertently dropped the blue leash used for P.E.T. P.A.L.S. visits. Even when I saw it under the table several days later, I didn't take the time to pick it

up. On the morning of Fletch's next visit, after I had put on my blue t-shirt and before I had said anything about "going to see his friends," Fletch went under the table and nudged the leash!

On visits, all I had to do was ask him, "Do you know any tricks?" and he would start doing a series of his favorites. His favorite "doggie joke," as I called them, was to steal a person's shoe and parade around with it until the owner begged him to give it back.

At home, he reminded me of what I was supposed to be doing at any given time, protected the house even down to the flies on the wall, and was the companion by my side or at my feet wherever I went. We were so attuned to each other that I didn't even realize he had grown quite deaf, until he stayed with a pet-sitter a few days and she noticed it. In my eyes, he was one very special dog.

Our good-bye last month came far too soon, as it always does, but I am so grateful for having had the privilege of sharing over twelve years with such a remarkable and faithful friend. I will rescue another dog and that dog will find its way into my heart, but Fletch, like all the rest of my pet family members, will never be replaced.

I thank all my wonderful P.E.T. P.A.L.S. friends for their support as I went through Fletch's last days. At times like these, I am fortunate to be included in a circle of people who love their pets enough to share them with others and who have experienced the great joys and deep sorrows that such love inevitably entails.
